The following information is provided in response to a request made by Libby Garvey over email on 4/12/2018, regarding the following question:

Remind me what we told the Clarendon Alliance last year? I believe we gave them some expectations along with their budget allocation.

Clarendon Alliance received the same general guidance and expectations as were set for the other community partnerships, as noted in budget guidance:

Minimum Standards for BIDs and Partnership Organizational Documents

The County Board finds that certain baseline documentation standards with respect to Arlington's three BIDs (Rosslyn, Crystal City, Ballston) and three Partnerships (Columbia Pike Revitalization Organization, Clarendon Alliance, Lee Highway Alliance) should be required as a pre-condition to FY 2018 and future years County funding in order to ensure public transparency, accountability and compliance with applicable County requirements. The Board directs the County Manager to include in its official agreements with these entities the requirement that organizational, board member, and board meeting documentation be made publicly available.

Clarendon Alliance is in compliance with these minimum standards. The County and the Alliance have fully executed the MOA and staff has verified the respective reporting and transparency components.
