Services

This brochure is a guide to mental health and substance abuse resources in Arlington County and Northern Virginia. Arlington County provides low-cost mental health services to indigent and low-income individuals and families who meet eligibility requirements. Persons with private insurance usually use services in the private sector.

Mental Illness Facts

Mental illnesses are biologically based brain disorders. They cannot be overcome through will power and are not related to a person's character or intelligence. Mental illness often strikes in the prime of life, especially during adolescence and young adulthood. All ages are susceptible, but the young and old seem most vulnerable.

Early identification and treatment of mental illness is important. By getting needed treatment early, recovery is accelerated and the brain is protected from further harm related to the course of the illness.

The best treatments for serious mental illnesses today are highly effective. Between 70 and 90 percent of individuals have significant reduction of symptoms and improved quality of life through a combination of pharmacological and psychosocial treatments and supports.

Crisis Intervention Team

The CIT team is comprised of specially trained law enforcement personnel, CIT officers work to recognize the symptoms of mental illness when responding to calls as well as to assist consumers in accessing treatment. Training includes first-hand experience with consumers and families, education on mental illness, and knowledge of community resources.
